☐ CBD & Phycox + Steroids + Famotidine - <i>Then</i>
☐ CBD & Phycox + Steroids + Famotidine + Gabapentin - <i>Then</i>
☐ CBD & Phycox + Steroids + Gabapentin + Methocarbamol - <i>Then</i>
